



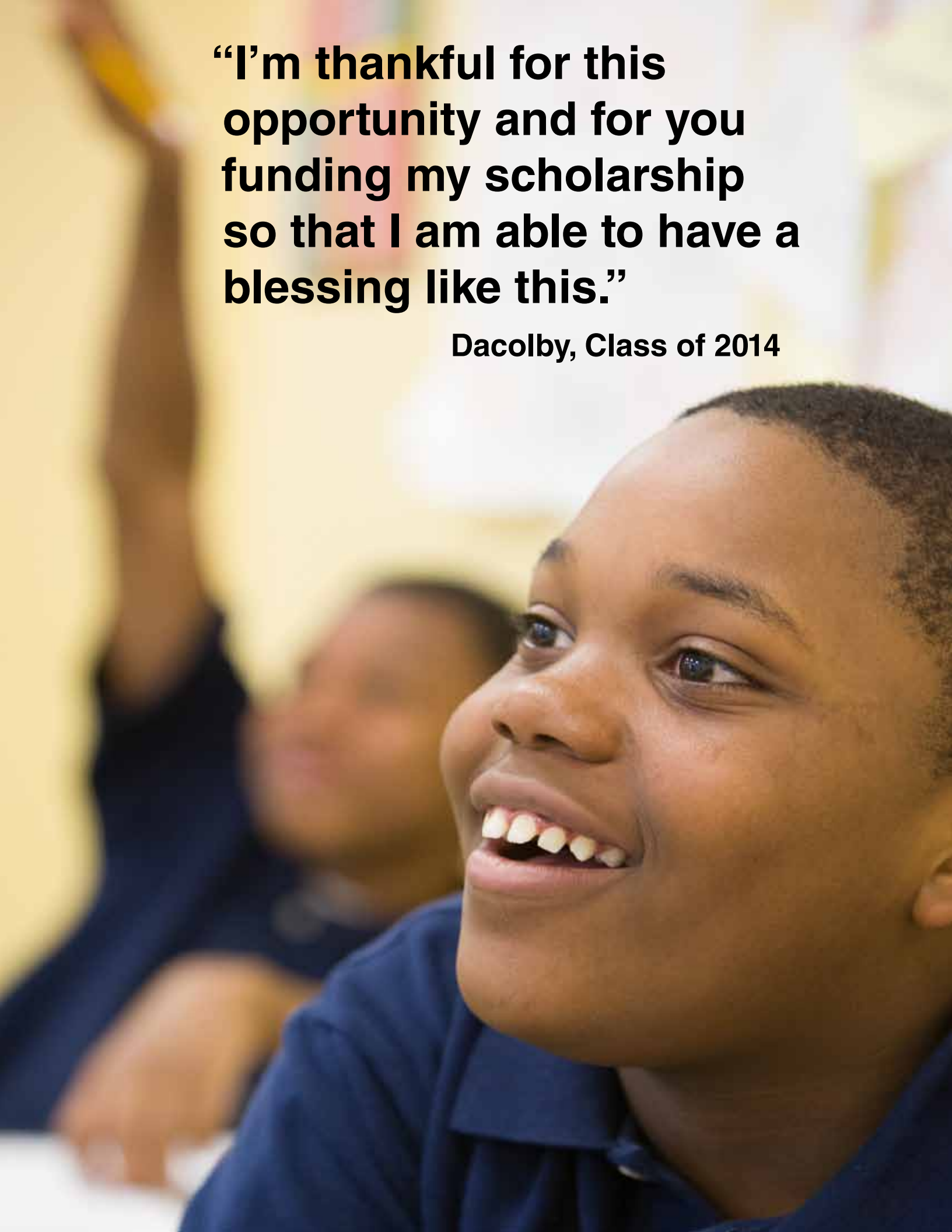

A Letter from the President

Dear Friends,

When I was seventeen years old, it was popular for rising seniors at my high school to make a week-long service trip to places like Cairo, Illinois or Nazareth Farm in West Virginia. My trip took me to Lacona, New York – a rural town where my classmates and I spent a week building porch steps, gardening and painting homes with a few local families.

My motivations for going on the trip were less than pure. Some senior friends who had just graduated told me how great a service trip had looked on their college applications. I also knew that a pretty girl whom I'd been unsuccessfully courting had signed up for the trips.

As it happened, the pretty girl – who is now my wife – was sent to Pennsylvania, and I suddenly found myself in upstate New York struggling to make sense of the material poverty I saw there. My principal worksite was the trailer home of a woman with three young children – a 10-year-old boy and two little girls. Their home sat just off a gravel road in an open field. On my first day there, the boy and I started talking and soon we were throwing around his football.

Our game of catch ended abruptly when his mom's boyfriend emerged from the trailer screaming at the boy about taking care of the family's dog. Shoulders slumped, the boy walked off to a tree where the dog was chained. The boyfriend then picked up his football and began throwing it to me. With each toss, he threw harder and farther – trying to throw the ball over my head. I couldn't understand why he wouldn't just let the boy have the happiness of a game of catch.

Weeks later, I remember sitting with my parents in our home trying to reconcile why that boy was consigned to his life while I was blessed with mine. In the years after leaving Lacona, the injustice of that young boy's life continued to gnaw at me. It all seemed horribly unfair. As I wrestled with these questions throughout college, a professor pushed me to take a teaching job at St. Ignatius Loyola Academy (SILA) – a full-scholarship middle school for boys in Baltimore.

SILA was one of several Nativity-model middle schools run by the Jesuits throughout the country. It was academically selective and challenged the young men enrolled there with long school days as well as a mandatory summer enrichment term from 6th grade through 8th grade.

We've modeled much of what we've built at Chicago Jesuit Academy on SILA, but **we've chosen not to be an academically selective school.** This means our students enter our school with a broader range of needs.

For some of our students, CJA is the school they've longed to attend. They find themselves finally safe and free to be intellectually curious. And, they catch fire. They push us to create new courses for them. They attend prestigious summer programs, and they win competitive scholarships to exceptional schools throughout the country.

Our students have tremendously difficult roads to travel. Some

come to us barely able to read as 10-year-olds. For others, home is a patchwork of apartments across the West Side or, at times, homeless shelters. For too many of our students, the violence of our neighborhood is omnipresent – erupting not only on our streets but in the hallways of their apartment buildings if not their homes as well. We strive to serve all of our students regardless of their academic achievement in their prior schools. We believe every child entrusted to our care is made in the image and likeness of God, and we believe they are called to do great things with their gifts.

Now that we have room to grow, we are committed to not only doubling our enrollment but also strengthening the resources we provide to our neediest students. Since CJA's founding in 2005, we have learned a horrible but true lesson: For most of our students, Chicago Jesuit Academy is their last and best chance of finding a path out of material poverty. It is a perilously difficult path, and I marvel at our students' fierce determination in charting such a radically different and heroic course for their lives.

The pages that follow detail our students' extraordinary accomplishments and our school's continued growth. They also recognize our generous friends who make Chicago Jesuit Academy possible through their sacrifices and their financial support. I find them to be hope-filled pages that offer a powerful reminder of the strength of our team and the courage of our students and alumni – whether they chronicle our 8th graders' final days with us or report on our oldest alumni studying at the City Colleges with the help of **One Million Degrees** or four-year universities such as Denison, DePaul, Fordham, Knox and Occidental thanks to scholarships like the **Gates Millennium Scholarship.**

Twenty years ago when I met that 10-year-old boy in Lacona, I could not have imagined how he would change my life. I'm ashamed to say that I do not remember his name, nor do I know what he has been able to make of his life. I hope that if he and I were to meet today he would look upon all that we are building at CJA, smile and ask me to have a game of catch.

Comprehensive Scholarship

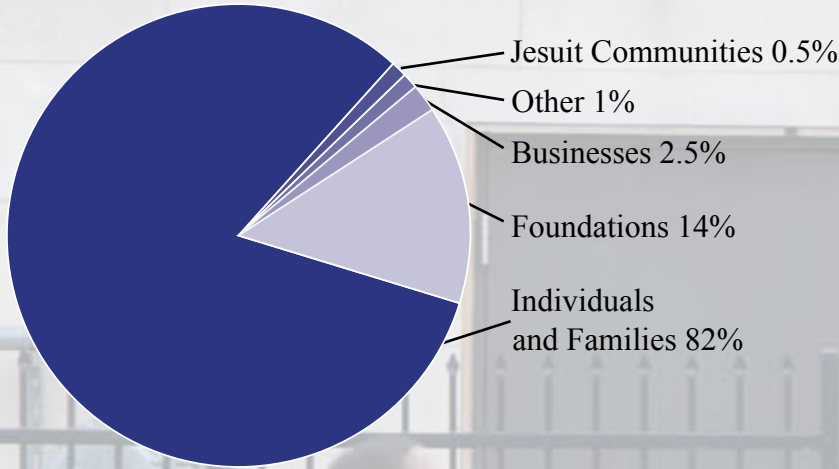

Funding Summary by Constituents



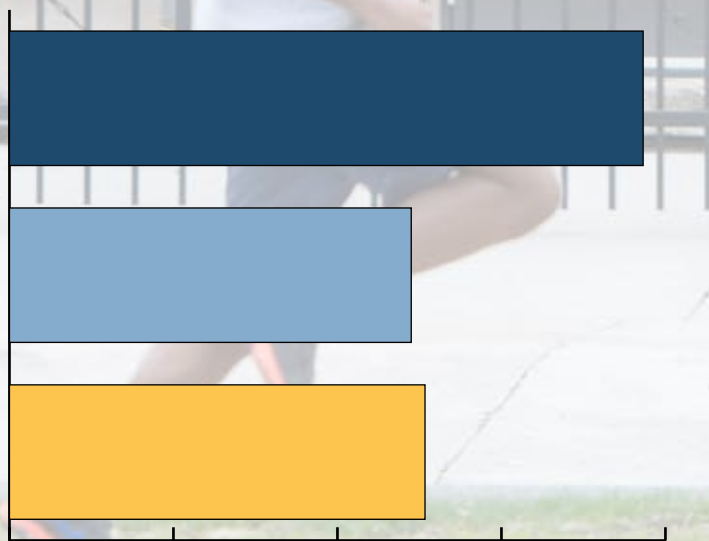

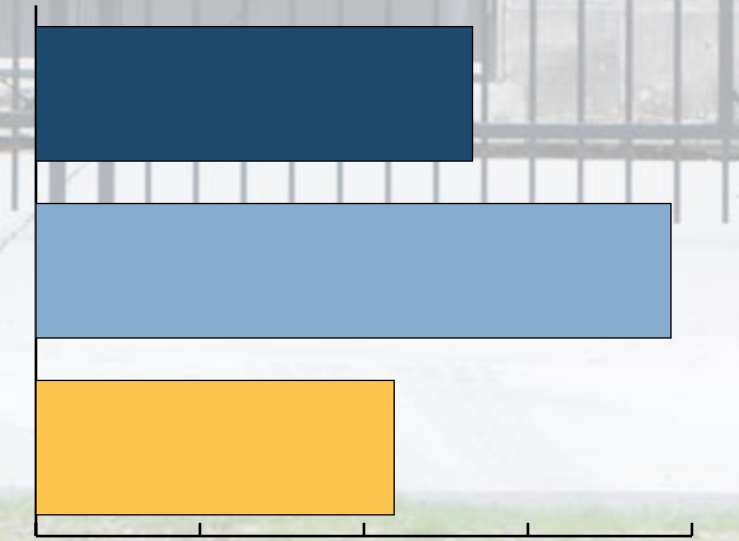

From CJA Forward

As CJA's middle school enrollment continues to grow, the broad alumni support offered to the 105 CJA alumni through the College-Persistence Programs is growing as well. As young men like Dakota (Class of 2014), Julian (Class of 2011) and DaMarcus (Class of 2009) navigate their path through secondary and post-secondary education, CJA continues to be a strong advocate for them and remains a critical source of programming and support.

It Starts in Middle School

As its name implies, alumni programming usually begins once a student graduates. However, at CJA, the College-Persistence Team views their work in a much different light.

“A crucial part of supporting our alumni is helping them look at their options and find the best-fit high schools while they are still CJA students.”

With this philosophy in mind, during the 2013-14 school year, the College-Persistence Team taught a bi-weekly class for 7th graders and a weekly class for 8th graders during the regular school day that helped students determine

the universe of high school options and take the steps necessary to enroll in those schools. As staff of the College-Persistence Team, Mr. Kemper, Mrs. Jessie Walsh, Mrs. Megan Lenihan and Mr. Matte Durkin have also prioritized meeting and building relationships with 7th- and 8th-grade families to ensure students and families are learning and growing together.

“When I started thinking about high school, I had a whole new perspective thanks to the CP Team. They helped me with applications to high schools in Chicago and scholarship organizations. My auntie came to visit the CP offices at CJA a lot so we could make sure we did the applications correctly and we talked about different options. When I found out I was accepted to Loyola Academy, I knew I wanted to go there.”

High School Support

Once students like Dakota graduate from CJA and matriculate to college prep high schools, the College-Persistence Team stays in close contact with the students and families as well as the high schools they are attending. The team provides after-school tutoring





at CJA, facilitates reunions with their CJA classmates, offers summer job opportunities, teaches summer college prep and ACT classes and brings alumni on visits to various colleges in the region.

Perhaps most importantly, the College-Persistence Team visits each alum at their college prep high schools, whether the school is in Chicago or a boarding school in Colorado, Virginia or Indiana. These visits help create or maintain relationships with counselors, teachers and administrators at the nearly 30 different high schools that CJA alumni now attend.

“During the school year, the CP Team sends me emails, letters, care packages and then once a year they visit me at school. This year they saw my soccer game and we went out and got dinner and ice cream. I’m glad they do that because it shows they care about you as a person rather than just a student.”

College Support

Often the greatest obstacle to a college degree for CJA alumni is a lack of “social capital” to support college readiness. Therefore, as CJA alumni determine their next steps to post-secondary education, the College-Persistence Team remains a consistent advocate and resource.

During the college application process, the team edits essays, makes alumni aware of possible scholarships like the Gates Millennium, helps complete the FAFSA, negotiates financial aid packages, coordinates partnerships with programs like One Million Degrees and advises alumni on selecting and enrolling in schools.

As CJA alumni enter and persist in college, the team works to provide them with summer opportunities for meaningful employment and academic enrichment.

In short, the care that began ten years before when they were fifth graders continues on through the College-Persistence Team. As our young men grow, CJA continues to grow with them.

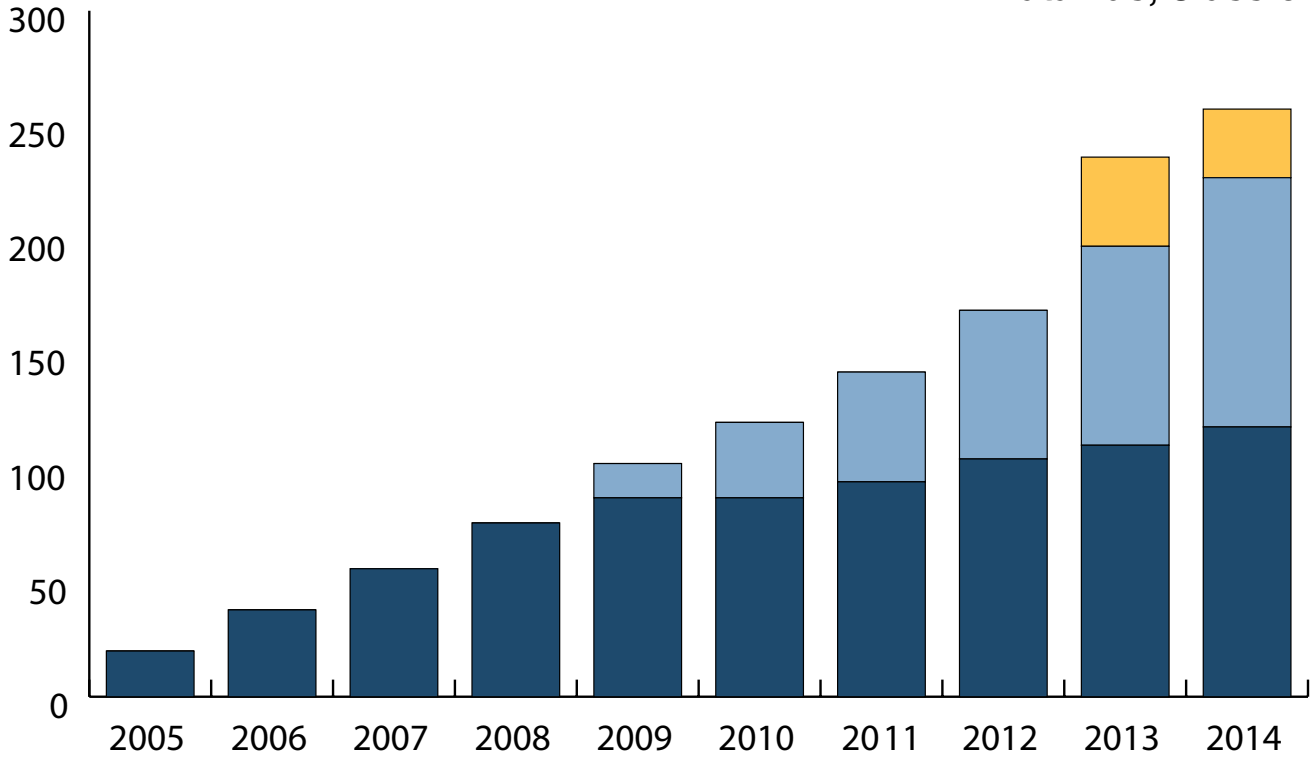

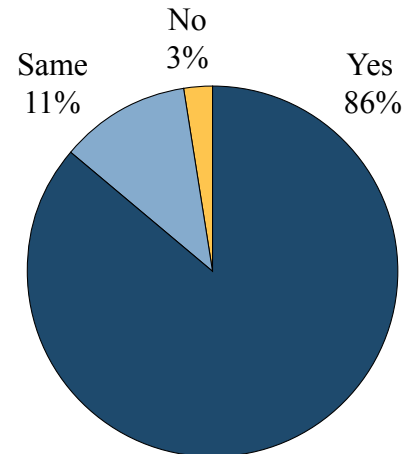
